BANKS. Substitute for H.B. No. 5414 (COMM) (File No. 961) AN ACT CONCERNING WELFARE REFORM (As amended by House Amendment Schedule "A").

Senator Markley of the 16th explained the bill, as amended, and moved its passage.

Senator Daniels of the 10th offered Senate Amendment Schedule "A" (LCO 8170) and moved its adoption and requested that the vote be taken by roll call.

Remarking unfavorably on the amendment were Senators Markley of the 16th and Connair of the 20th.

Remarking favorably on the amendment was Senator Barrows of the 2nd.

The Chair ordered the vote be taken by roll call.

The following is the result of the vote:

On the roll call vote Senate Amendment Schedule "A" was rejected.

The following is Senate Amendment Schedule "A".

After line 507, insert sections 21 and 22 as follows and renumber the remaining section accordingly:

"Sec. 21. (NEW) The labor commissioner, in cooperation with the private industry councils established pursuant to the Job Training Partnership Act (P.L. 97-300), shall establish a program providing job training services and support services for persons whose individual gross income is less than sixty per cent of the federal poverty level and who are members of the hard core unemployed. Any funds provided for such program shall be distributed, in accordance with the provisions of said Act, among the private industry councils on the basis of the comparative needs of geographic areas and the incidence of economic disadvantage.

Sec. 22. (a) The sum of one million dollars is appropriated to the labor department from the general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985, for the purpose of providing grants to the private industry councils for the job training programs established pursuant to section 21 of this act.

(b) The funds appropriated in subsection (a) of this section, for the purposes therein specified, shall not lapse on June 30, 1985, and such funds shall continue to be available for such purposes during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986."

In line 508, after "act" insert "shall take effect from its passage, except that sections 1 to 20, inclusive,"

[Senator Markley of the 16th explained the bill, as amended, by House Amendment Schedule "A" and on his motion it was placed on the consent calendar in concurrence with the House.
